 She is She's  
 It is It's

## Negative / short form

I am not I'm not  
 You are not You aren't  
 We are not We aren't  
 They are not They aren't  
 He is not He isn't  
 She is not She isn't  
 It is not It isn't

## Interrogative

Am I?  
 Are you?  
 Are we?  
 Are they?  
 Is he?  
 Is she?  
 Is it?
